This free report is a compilation of 25 markets from our database that pay freelancers up to or around 20 cents per word. Note that many publications pay a range of fees, so this doesn't mean that every piece is paid at exactly 20 cents per word. For example one publication states in their guidelines that they pay 10-20 cents per word.

I trust that this sample list will give you a good idea of the type of markets you can expect to find in our database and in every issue of our newsletter.

I wish you every success with your writing and I hope your writing business grows stronger as a result of subscribing to Worldwide Freelance Writer.

How to Use This List

This is a list of publications that work with freelance writers. For each publication I have provided a title, brief description, payment details, and a direct link to the publication's Writer's Guidelines on the Internet.

There are two reasons for this format:

1. I have deliberately included markets that publish their Writer's Guidelines online. You will be able to verify the latest requirements directly from the publication.
2. If I reproduced the detail of each publication's guidelines in this document, that information would go out of date very quickly, because publications' editorial requirements are constantly changing.

What to do if a link doesn't work:

Webmasters change their web sites all the time. If the name of a web page is changed from guidelines.htm to writers.htm, the link in this list will no longer work. I promise you in advance that this *will* happen.

Here's what you should do:

1. Check out the main home page of the publication's web site, e.g. www.publication.com. This is less likely to have changed. Visit their main page, and click on 'About', 'Contact', 'Submissions', 'Contributions', 'Masthead' or 'Site Map'. In most cases this will help you to quickly discover the new location of their guidelines.
2. Email me to see if I know the new location. My email address is editor@worldwidefreelance.com
